If a society gives workers more knowledge, they will be able to use machines in a more complex way and to follow more complex instructions, yielding manufactured goods of greater value; this process is often known as investing in human capital. In the late twentieth century, the physical capital is so abundant and natural resources so limited that countries are beginning to appreciate the importance of improving human resources if they are to continue to grow.
