AOCOMMODATION

The University has nine Halls of Residence*. Most of the rooms are single although there are a few double rooms, Students are required to keep their room, clean and reasonably tidy. <u>'Thev</u> also have to share responsibility with other residents for keeping kitchens and bathrooms clean.

There is a big opportunity to make friends and join in social activities with over 2,000 students on the site. All students are encouraged to contribute to the life of the community. In each Hall there are teachers who offer guidance and support whenever it is needed. All Halls are mixed and contain students from different countries and from different faculties.

Catering Halls* provide breakfast and evening meal from Monday to Friday and some meals at weekends. Students always enjoy eating there.

TRANSPORT

The Halls are about two mile5-'from the University and are on a regular bus route. In addition, the Students' Union organises an evening bus service between the Union and the Halls. The University is within walking distance and many students use bicycles. Car parking is difficult and students are discouraged from bringing a car to Bristol University.

SPORTS FACILITIES

The University has a good range of sports facilities, including squash courts, a swimming pool and numerous tennis courts. Each Hall has several sports teams providing the opportunity to become involved in competitive and friendly sports at all levels. In addition to this, the Athletic Union has over 50 clubs which offer a wide range of sporting activities both competitive and

recreational.
